PREFACE

Thank you for choosing In Win IW-RS212-02M. This manual is written for system technicians who are responsible for installation, troubleshooting, managing, and repairing this server chassis. This document provides the overview of all the features of the chassis, a list of accessories or other components you may need to finish the installation, troubleshooting methods, and instructions of adding and removing components on the In Win IW- RS212-02M. For the latest version of this manual, you may visit In Win's server website to download the latest updated version.

SAFETY INFORMATION

To ensure safe and smooth operation of your In Win IW- RS212-02M, it is essential that you choose an appropriate location for the system, provide an appropriate operating environment, and adequate power for all components of the system. As you plan for installation, follow the guidelines below to ensure that the system and its environment are safely and appropriately positioned for efficient operation and service. Your system should be installed and serviced only by technically qualified persons.

Environment selection: The system is designed to operate in a typical office environment. The location should be a clean, dry, and free of airborne particles; a well-ventilated room and away from sources of heat including direct sunlight and radiators; it should keep the sources of vibration or physical shock away; the space should be with a properly grounded wall outlet, and with sufficient space to access the power supply cords. The operation environment temperature should be around 0°C to 40°C (32°F to 104°F).

Heed safety instructions: Before working with In Win IPC/Storage server/ System products, we strongly recommend you are using this guide as a reference and follow the safety instructions. The instructions in this manual will help you ensure and maintain compliance with existing product certifications and approvals. Follow the described, regulated components mentioned in this manual. Use of non UL listing products or other regulatory did not approvals will make non-compliance with product regulations in the region(s) in which the product is sold.

System power on/off: The power button DOES NOT totally turn off the system AC power. To remove the power of system, you have to unplug the AC power cord from the outlet or system's power supply units. Make sure the power cord is unplugged before you open the chassis, add, or remove any components.



Hazardous conditions, devices and cables: Hazardous electrical conditions usually present on power supply units, and communication cables. Disconnect the power cord, and any other device which attached to the server before opening the case. Otherwise, it will raise the risk of personal injury or equipment damage.

Electrostatic discharge (ESD) and ESD protection: In most cases, ESD damages disk drives, electronic boards, and other parts. We recommend that you work the installation only at an ESD free space. If the situation does not allow, perform ESD protection actions by wearing an anti-static wrist strap attached to ground any unpainted metal surface on your server during your operation.

Installing or removing jumpers: A jumper is a short length of conductor used to close, open or bypass part of an electronic circuit. Jumpers on In Win backplane have a small tab on top that you can pick up with your fingertips. Grip the jumper carefully, and plug the jumper to cover the jumper pins on the backplane. Once you need to remove the jumper, gripping the jumper, and carefully pull out without squeezing.

CAUTION

To avoid damage and prove your safety, please notice and following the terms listed below:



- 1. No to populate hard drives and turn on the power before the system is settle down.
- 2. Tighten or loosen all the screws, please use screw driver to operate.
- 3. Apply the correct screws which packed in the accessories box.
- 4. For your safety, it requires at least two persons lift, and place the unit.
- 5. Before mounting the unit to the cabinet, make sure the rail is installed correctly.
- 6. When installing and removing any module or parts, please operate by the handles.

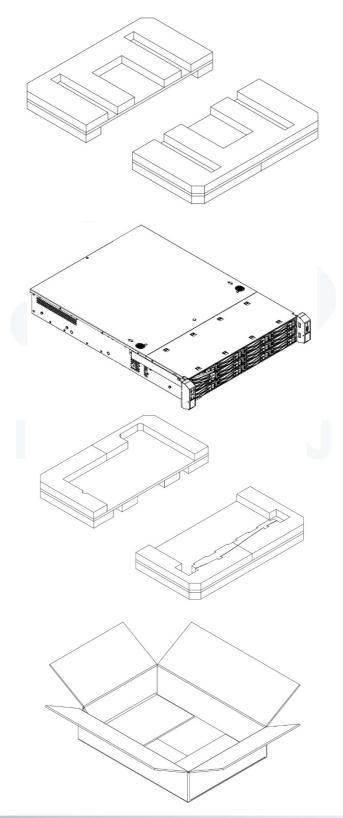

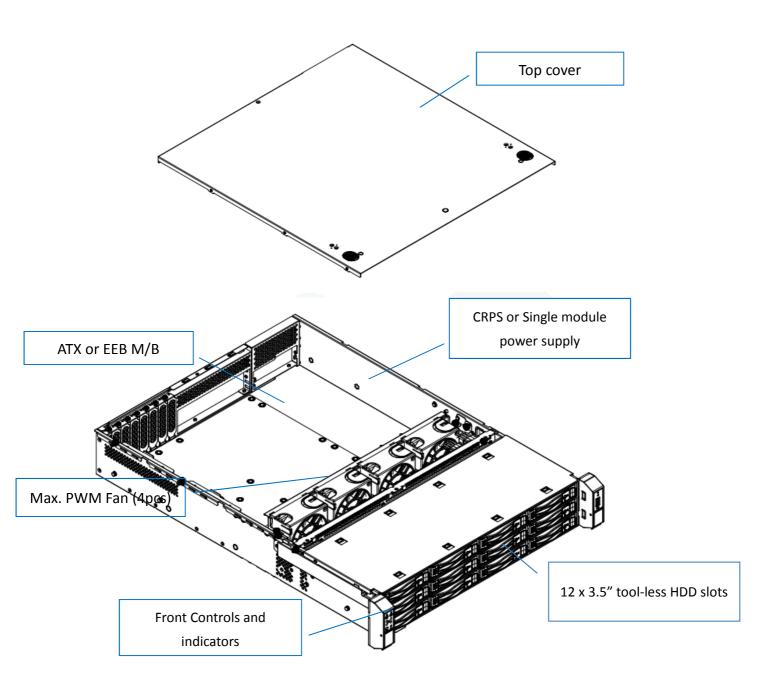

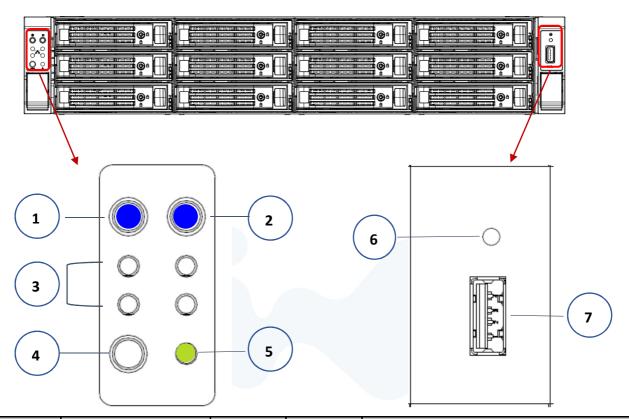

After unlock and removing the front cover, you can see the 12 disk bays, and the control panel, USB IO ports and indicators on the handles.



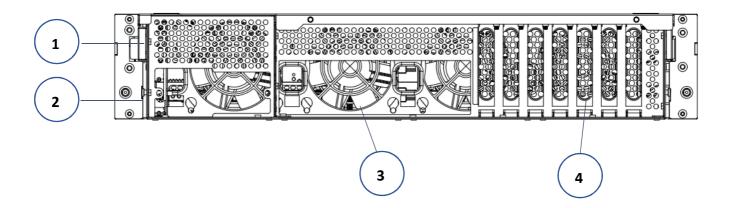

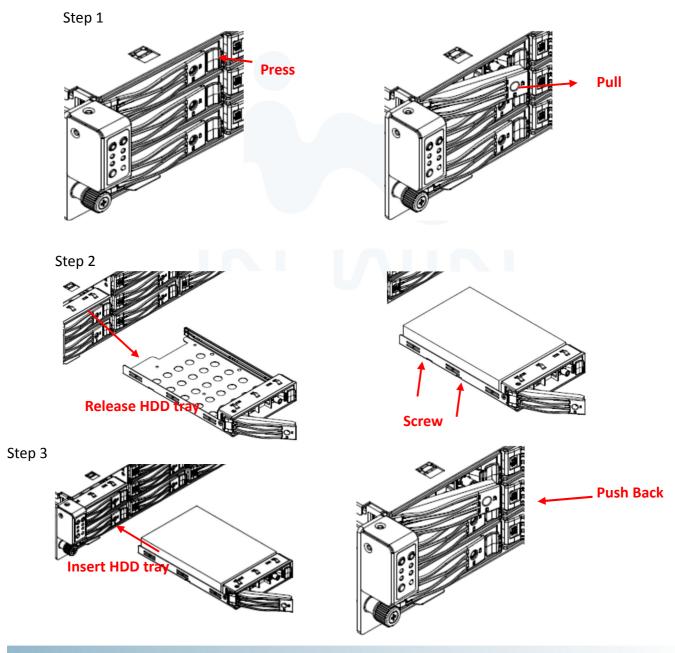
2 Hardware Installation

2.1 Removing and Installing a Hard Drive

In Win IW-RS212-02M has 12 external hot-swap disk bays, which support both 3.5" hard drives, 2.5" hard drives, and 2.5" SSDs. Also, IW-RS212-02M supports 2 internal 2.5" hard drives or SSDs for building system OS.

2.1.1 Installing a Hard Drive

- Step 1: Press the release button then pull outward the disk tray
- Step 2: Populate the hard drive on the tray with 4 screws which you can find in the accessory box.
- Step 3: Push back the tray back to the disk bay, and push back the lever until you hear "click"



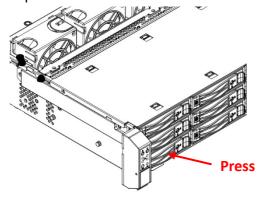

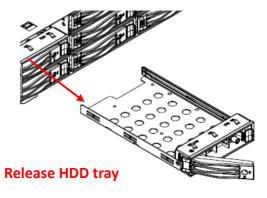


2.1.2 Removing a Hard Drive

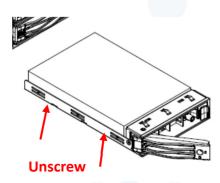
- Step 1: Press the release button then pull outward the disk tray.
- Step 2: Loosen the 4 screws and unmount the hard drive.

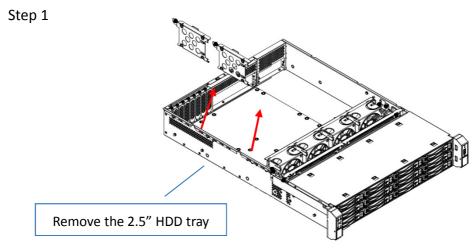

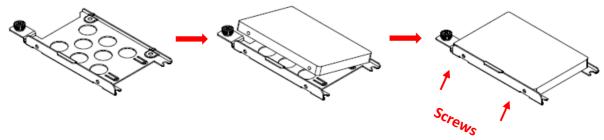
2.1.3 Installing a Hard Drive

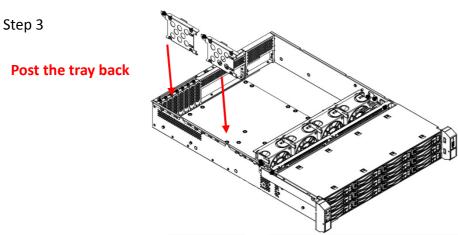
- Step 1: Loosen the thumb screw to remove the disk tray from the left wall of the chassis
- Step 2: Populate the hard drive on the tray with 4 screws which you can find in the accessory box.
- Step 3: Post the tray back to the chassis, and tighten the thumb screw

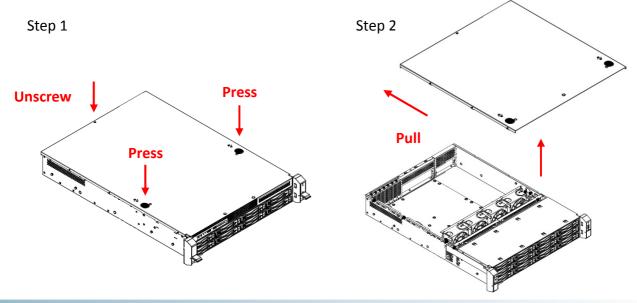
2.2 Removing and placing Top Cover

2.2.1

- Step 1: Release the screw on the back-end of cover, and press inward the blue buttons then push backward the top cover.
- Step 2: Lift the top cover to remove.

2.2.2

- Step 1: To place the top cover, place the cover on to the chassis, and make sure the wedges are in the right location.
- Step 2: Push forward the cover and make sure the clip clicks, then screw up to fix the cover.





2.3 Removing and Installing the fan wall

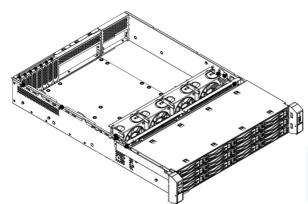
The fan module of IW-RS212-02M is flexible which you can move forward or backward to optimize the cooling efficiency. Removing the fan wall before posting the motherboard to get more space for the processing. After the motherboard and components are installed, using the bracket to organize the cable sets.

2.3.1 Removing a fan wall

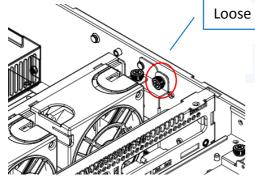
Step 1: Unplug the fans' power cable and remove the fan units

Step 2: Loosen the thumb screw and lift the fan wall from the chassis

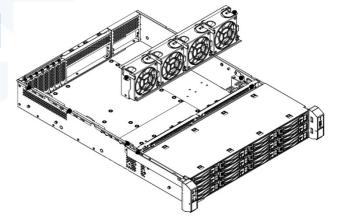

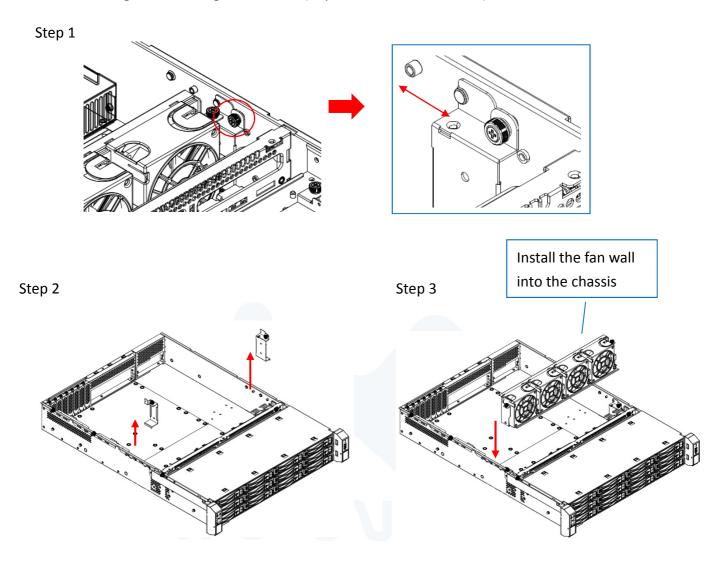

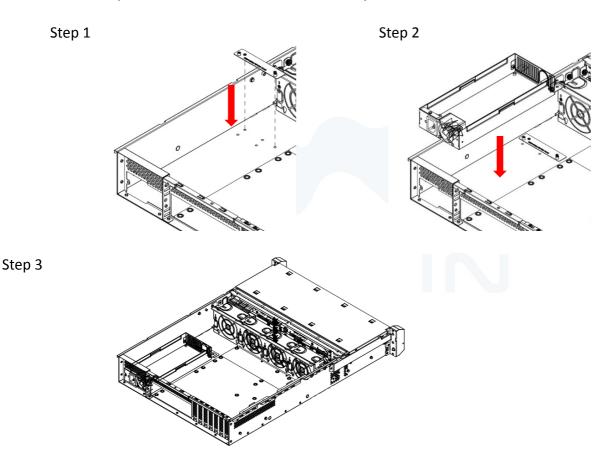
2.4 Removing and Installing a PSU

In Win IW-RS212-02M supports single and redundant power supply unit. Users can select power supply according to the environment's requirements.

Note: The different PSU needs different rear and side bracket. The accessory box includes the bracket sets for supporting models.

2.4.1 Installing Single PSU

- Step 1: Post the rear bracket to the chassis
- Step 2: Place the PSU to the rear right corner of the chassis and make sure the screw holes meet the chassis frame and bracket.
- Step 3: Use the screws form the accessory box to fix the PSU on rear window frame.

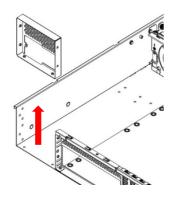


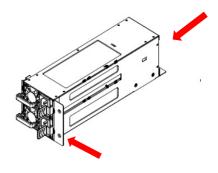
2.4.2 Installing Redundant PSU

- Step 1: Unscrew and remove the rear frame at the rear right position of the chassis.
- Step 2: Mount the rear and side bracket onto the housing case
- Step 3: Find the side bracket from the accessory box, and mount it on the side of rear window frame
- Step 4: Place the PSU housing case to the chassis, make sure the brackets' screw holes meet the rear window frame. Use screws to fix the PSU housing case.

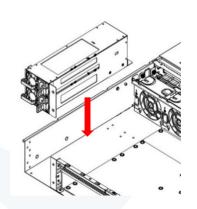

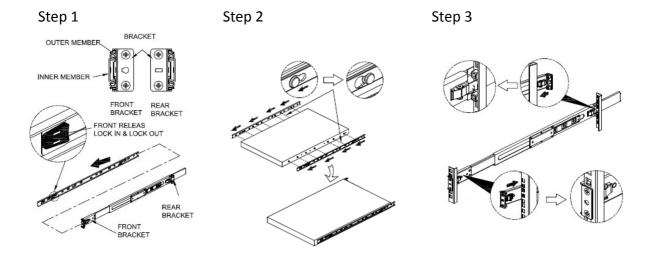

2.5 Installing a Slide Rail

In Win IW-RS212-02M is a rackmount model, which support EIA-RS310D standard cabinet and chassis rack. In Win provides standard slide rail to let users mount the chassis on to the cabinet.

- 2.5.1 Identifying the sections of the Slide Rail
- 2.5.2 Installing a Slide Rail
 - Step 1: Release the inner rail from the slide
 - Step 2: Mount the inner rails onto the chassis by the direction which the arrows show.

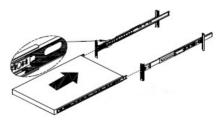




2.5.3 Mount the chassis onto the cabinet

Step1: Make sure the ball bearing retainer is at the forefront.

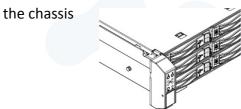
Step2: Insert the inner rail to the outer rail which has already locked up on the cabinet.



Step3: Mount the inner rail onto the chassis by the direction which the arrows show on the image.



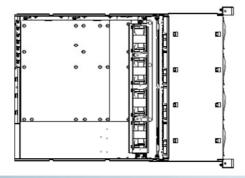
Step4: Pull up the plastic chip on the chassis' handles, and tighten the thumb screws to fix



2.6 Installing Motherboard

Before installing the motherboard, please find the IO shield form your motherboard package, and install it to the system IO window 1.2.2 shows. If you cannot find the IO shield, please check with your motherboard vendor, or contact In Win for IO shield OEM service.

- Step 1: Measure the motherboard location and removing the plastic dots to appear the holes.
- Step 2: Install the steel pillars, which you can find in the accessories box to the holes matching the motherboard's mounting holes, you may use a flathead screw driver.
- Step 3: Place the motherboard down to the chassis, and make sure the pillars' threaded holes are matching the mounting holes on the motherboard.
- Step 4: Use hex screws from the accessories box to fix the motherboard in the chassis.





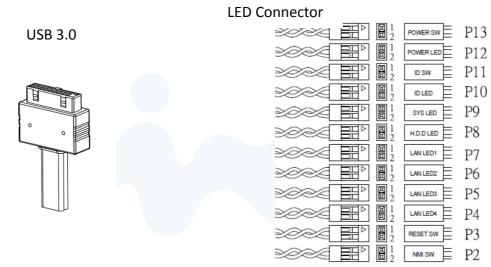
2.7 Connection Cable

2.2.1 Connecting backplane through SAS connectors

In Win IW-RS212-02M needs SAS cable connecting the backplane and your motherboard or RAID controller. In Win provides verified SAS cable for installation, please contact In Win local partners and sales to get more information.

2.7.2 Connecting LED cable, front control panel and front USB IO ports

As 1.2.1 descripts, In Win IW-RS-02M built-in a set of front control panel and USB access ports. You need to cover the connectors to the pins on the motherboard to active the functions. The pin function and location you can find from your motherboard's user guide.

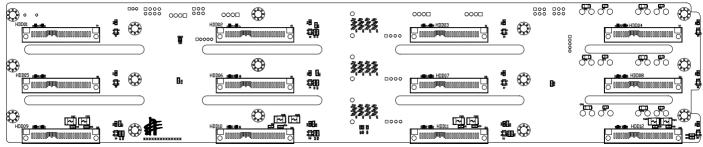

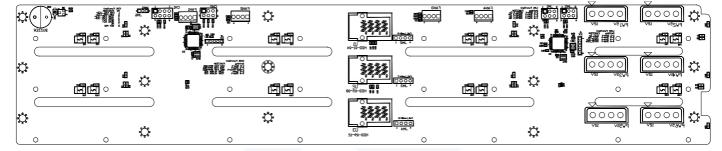

To reach best performance and avoid system failure, In Win strongly recommend users choosing the components from In Win's compatibility list. All the components are tested in In Win's lab and assured the components are working well with In Win's chassis.

5 Q&A

a. What are the function of backplane?

A: The backplane is the bridge which connects the hard drives and export the signal to the motherboard. Also, backplane provides the LED signals indicating the status of the hard drives, and alarming when the system temperature is abnormal.

b. Does backplane supports 6Gb SAS?

A: In Win IW-RSXXX-02M in default is with 12Gb SAS backplane. The 12Gb SAS connector is not alignment with 6Gb SAS. In Win provides OEM/ODM service, user can contact In Win sales for customization.



c. Does the chassis support 3.5", 2.5", SAS and SATA drive? Can I mix the different type of drives in an enclosure?

A: In Win IW-RSXXX-02M supports both 3.5" and 2.5" form factor's SAS/SATA disks. It allows different types of disks work together in an enclosure. Yet, to reach the best performance, we recommend following the motherboard or RAID controller vendors' instruction deploying you hard drives to each the best performance.

d. Does the chassis support flash drive?

Any SSD supports SAS or SATA connection can be attached to the In Win IW-RSXXX-02M, but beware the NVMe SSD is not supported. We recommend referencing In Win's compatibility list to check if your SSD is listed, or referencing the information to purchase SSD.

e. If I don't need the front cover, can I have the standard handle?

In Win IW-RSXXX-02M supports both standard handle and bezel handle. If you would like your chassis with standard metal handle, please contact your local reseller to purchase the bezel package for replacement.

f. Do the chassis support mirrored OS disks?

In Win IW-RSXXX-02M models supports at least 2 internal disks, RS316-02M and RS424-02M have built-in 2bay hot swap module. Yet, the disk mirroring is defined by your motherboard or your RAID 1 controller card. You may check the vendor's guide to mirror your OS disks.

g. Can it support small form factor MB such as M-ATX and Mini-ITX?

In Win IW-RSXXX-02M supports motherboard range from Mini-ITX to EEB. Unless you would like to mount a customized motherboard which not meet Intel's standard, you will need to contact In Win partners or sales for customization service.

h. Do I need a RAID controller card to connect the backplane?

If you would like to construct a solid hardware RAID system, it is required. However, using the RAID controller card or not, is depends on your purpose and budget. We recommend discussing with In Win's channel partner for their suggestions.

i. Where can I buy the SAS cable?

6Gb SAS to 4 SATA or 6Gb SAS to 6Gb SAS are standard cable that you easily buy from many vendors. You can buy the verified cable from In Win to eliminate the compatibility issues.
